The majority of negative online interactions tend to happen in the evenings or on weekends, so having open conversations about online behaviour is important. Next week the Cambridge schools are hosting a parent evening with digital safety expert Rob Cope from Our Kids Online to provide guidance on keeping children safe online. Conceptual Curriculum

Our 2025 conceptual curriculum will focus on *Tūrangawaewae*, *Kaitiakitanga*, *Innovation*, and *Hauora*, providing students with meaningful opportunities to explore identity, sustainability, creativity, and well-being. Our first concept of Tūrangawaewae supports students to understand where they come from and develop a greater sense of belonging. This links to our HERO value of Relationships which is extremely important for this age group.

These concepts will be woven through different curriculum areas to create engaging, relevant, and challenging learning experiences. A strong focus will also be placed on Reading, Writing, and Mathematics, supported by research-based learning programmes such as The Code, Writer's Toolbox, and Oxford Mathematics. Our teachers are actively engaging in professional development to ensure high-quality teaching in these areas.

Sun Safetu

At CMS, we encourage students to become more self-managing, but we also recognise they still need support in making healthy choices. During Terms 1 and 4, school hats are a compulsory uniform item and must be brought to school daily. Sunscreen is available in classrooms, and teachers regularly remind students to apply it before breaks.

How you can help at home: Encourage your child to apply sunscreen before leaving for school. Ensure they bring their school hat daily. Discuss the importance of sun safety and making healthy choices

Due to the unfortunate weather last week, and other events in the coming weeks we will not be holding our Whānau Picnic this term. Attendance Matters

One of the things we are going to continue to focus on in 2025 is the importance of regular school attendance for our tamariki. Here are some key points to keep in mind:

Why Attendance is Important: Did you know that if a student misses just one day of school every two weeks, they can miss over a year of school by the time they reach 16? Regular attendance is important for building strong learning habits and good life skills.

Your Role: As parents and caregivers, you play a huge role in ensuring that your child attends school every day. It's a shared responsibility between home and school.

Notification of Absences: Please inform us if your child will be absent for any reason, such as a tangi or a medical procedure. Please be aware that family holidays or extracurricular activities not organised by the school are not justified reasons for absence.
